ANNUAL REPORT: July 1, 2022 - June 30, 2023

The mission of the Kansas Coordinating Council on Early Childhood Developmental Services is to ensure that a comprehensive service delivery system of integrated services is available in Kansas to all children with or at risk for developmental delays from birth through age 5 and their families.

INTRODUCTION

The Kansas Interagency Coordinating Council (SICC) is based in both federal law and state statute. This council is responsible for advising and assisting the Kansas governor, legislature, and state agencies on matters that impact Kansas families with children, ages birth to 5, who have, or are at risk for, developmental delays and to ensure that a comprehensive service delivery system of integrated services is available in Kansas for these children. The majority of the Council members are appointed by the governor (e.g., parents, providers. public members) The remainder of the council members are appointed by state agency heads:

- Kansas State Department of Education (KSDE)
- Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE)
- Kansas Department for Children and Families (DCF)
- Kansas Department for Aging and Disabilities Services (KDADS)
- Kansas Board of Regents (KBOR)
- Kansas Insurance Commissioner

Along with two Kansas legislators selected by the Legislative Coordinating Council.

Council activities are guided by statute, by-laws and the mission statement and are largely driven by the Annual Strategic Planning meeting and the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA-Attachment #1) with state agency partners.

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ANNUAL PRIORITIESAND GOALS

During Fiscal Year2023, the council focused on community services and functions of the SICC. Topics have included:

- Services to children and families by local Part C programs.
- Implementation of Ages & Stages Questionnaires® partnerships for screening in communities.
- Inclusion in Least Restrictive Environments for children ages 3-5.
- Supports for Local ICCs (LICCs).
- SICC State Agency Memorandum of Agreement.

KANSAS ICC MEETINGS AND ACTIONS

All SICC meetings follow an agenda sent to members in advance. Standing agenda items include introductions, approval of previous minutes, approval of agenda, public forum, old business, committee reports, agency reports, staff report and report from chair. Meeting took place in person quarterly and virtually because of COVID19.

Orientation for new members was provided. Additionally, information was shared with all members on the role of the Council during the February meeting. Meeting agendas, minutes, reports and handouts are posted on the website at https://www.kansasicc.org/meeting-dateslocations.html

Beginning in August 2018, the SICC set in place the standard practice of hearing reports from a local service program and a state-level program or project (Attachment # 3). The intent of this practice was to engage both local and state partners, as well as educate the SICC members regarding supports, services, and programs in the state. By providing this information, the work of the SICC will be facilitated, and members of the Council will have additional information regarding services that can be referenced to the mission of ensuring a comprehensive system of integrated services.



Aug. 19, 2022 (Zoom) - The Council's Annual Report and agenda were approved. Members of the SICC decided which committees they would work with for the duration of the current fiscal year. Committee and agency reports were provided.

Sept. 16, 2022 (Zoom) – Amanda Petersen Director for Early Childhood at KSDE, provided information on Aggregate Statewide ASQ Data. Melissa Rooker Executive Directorfor the Kansas Children's Cabinet provided and update on the Preschool Development Grant. Committee and agency reports were provided.

Oct. 21, 2022 (Zoom) – Liz Stone, from Southeast Kansas Birth to 3 Infant Toddler Services, provided an overview of the program. Erica Figuero, University of Kansas Center for Public Partnerships and Research (KU CPPR) hared with the Council an update about the Help Me Grow Model. Committee and agency reports were provided.

Nov. 18, 2022 (In Person-Topeka, K§ – Maureen Hernandez, from Leavenworth County Infant Toddler Services, provided an overview of the program. Dr. Jerrie Brooks, from Fort Hays University provided information on their Early Childhood Unified Teacher Training Program. Committee and agency reports were provided.

Dec. 18, 2022 (Zoom) – Stephanie Willis, from Russell Child Development Center, Finney County provided an overview of the program. Heather Staab, from KDHE provided information on Child Abuse Protection and Treatment A ct (CAPTA)Committee and agency reports were provided. Kristy Cotton announced that she would be leaving her position as the KSDE staff person.

Jan 20, 2023 (Zoom) – Lor Soo Hoo from Marion County Infant Toddler Services presented on the program and the successes they have experienced through community partnerships. Ali Rary, Assistant Clinical Professor from Wichita State University presented information about the program to support paraprofessionals completion of the teacher certification program.

Feb. 17, 2023 (Zoom) – Cathy Redelberger, Leavenworth Director of Special Education, presented about their program's improvement in KSDE SPP/APR Indicator 6 and the new coordination among early childhood. Amanda Peterson, Director of Early Childhood with KSDE, shared the latest ASQ measures for Kansas. Since the Kansas initiative was implemented in 2015 the number of children screened for developmental delays and received services has significantly increased. The new staff KSDE staff person, Stacy Novak, wasintroduced.

March 24, 2023 (Zoom) – Stacy Novak (Clarke), the SICC staff person administered a survey to get feedback on the SICCs support of LICCs. Jennifer Slagle, KDCF, presented on Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act (CAPTA) and Children's Justiæ Act (CJA). Tricia Waggoner discussed a DRAFT copy of the Kansas Part C grant and the council voted and approved the proposed General Education Provisions Act (GEPA) statement.

April 21, 2023 (Zoom) – McKinley Phillips from Sunflower ICC presented on their Sunflower Developmental Fair. Clarification was provided on Senate Bill 24 in relation to Autism and Part C. Jennifer Page | 7

Francois, Kansas Institute for Early Childhood & KCCTO presented on the Kansas Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health (IECMH) activities, the infant toddler special education support for child care, and the Zero to Three IECMH Finance Cohort work on improving Medicaid funding.

May 19, 2023 (Zoom) – Kayzy Bigler, KDHEpresented about Help Me Grow Kansas and gave a brief update on the Bri dges program. KSDE McKinneyVento staff members were in attendance.

June 15, 2023 (In person and virtual) - The council had its annual strategic planning session. Monica Murnan and staff from The Learning Tree Institute at Greenbush, facilitated conversations focused on the role of the SICC and identified potential goals for the next year.

STAFF REPORT

Staff person to the SICC provided training and completed virtual visits to 19 different LICCs across the state, with some of them being visited multiple times (MOA Pg. 4, E, Attachment 1).

Staff also presented updates, provided technical support, and gave updates on the state agencies' work to LICCs. A grant application form was developed for LICCs to request funding for local activities. Presentations were given on a variety of topics that focused on the needs of each LICC and their community outreach ini tiatives. Staff also worked with three local programs, and their LICCs, where local lead agency changes were initiated

SICCstaff completed 31 total technical assistance and support visits to LICCs around the state by attending virtually, including:

 REACH ICC, Pony Express LICC, SE KS Regional LICC, Riley County LICC, Franklin County LICC, North Country Connection LICC, RCDC ICC (CFN), Leavenworth County LICC, Central Kansas ICC, Wyandotte County LICC, Butler County ICC, Douglas County ICC, Flint Hills ICC, Harvey County ICC, Johnson County ICC, McKids ICC, Sedgwick County ICC, Sumner County LICC, and Marion County ICC.

Staff spoke on a variety of subjects that focused on the unique needs of each LICC. Examples included:

- The role of the LICC in relation to the local lead agency for Part C
- The steps and process to take in selecting a new local lead agency
- Updates from Topeka/the Legislature

An orientation PowerPoint (Attachment #5) was used for new SICC/LICC members. Meeting minutes, agendas, logistics and locations were also arranged by the staff (MOAPg. 4, D, Attachment 1). The annual report was also prepared by the staff person and reviewed by the full council before being submitted prior to Aug. 30, 2023 (MOAPg. 4, F, Attachment #1).

HIGHLIGHTS AND ACTIVITIES

Council activities are primarily directed by the Annual Strategic Plan and the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the state agencies. A portion of our activity takes place at the committee level. A list of council accomplishments for FY 23 includes:

- Reviewed and approved the proposed KDHE GEPA (General Education Provisions Act) statement.
- Met with the Governor's Appointments Office focusing on meeting the requirements of IDEA regarding SICC membership.
