Access to services and supports as prevention as opposed to addressing crisis after it happens.

Began September 2023 Kansas Linking Infrastructure for Nurturing Kids

#### PURPOSE OF KAN-LINK

- The Kansas Children's Cabinet and Trust Fund (KCCTF) and Department for Children and Families (DCF) will improve coordination, collaboration, alignment, and infrastructure between the Kansas early care and education (ECE) systems and the network of child abuse prevention and foster care providers at the state and local level.
- The project aim is to ensure access to a robust and interconnected network of comprehensive ECE services and supports to help children in Kansas thrive in their communities.



Currently, 10 Family Resource Centers in Kansas they'll be working with. Evaluating gaps to align and coordinate to fill the gaps.

Questions & comments:

- Who will be hosting the pilots?
  - o Family Resource Centers
- Are many resource centers using IRIS?
  - o TBD. It can be a community supplied resource.
- "families of color" ? why is that included? How are you going to address this?
  - There is a disproportionate number of children of color being referred to the child welfare system. They want to decrease referrals for all children including children of color. They will be addressing implicit bias
- Training is needed because families in poverty are reported due to lack of resources.
- What enhancements will be in the pilot to address language barriers?

• This is to be determined. Language and cultural considers can be determined at the local level to inform the state approach.

How will the community know they can give feedback?

Family Resource centers are organizing this and it will be intentional. Participatory action research.

How are you going to develop trust with families?

The goal is to provide resources, skills and support so that families can advocate for themselves. They will be advocating for utilizing services to prevent distrust. They want to implement this in a way that supports trust.

Will this include home based early childhood services?

Yes

What "lived experiences" are you looking for?

Families that have accessed services, experience with foster care, and almost all family experiences.

#### Local Program Update:

<u>High Quality Onboarding Leading to Higher Job Satisfaction and Retention.</u> Stephanie Wills, infant toddler coordination, from Russell Child Development Center in Garden City, Kansas.

- Job applicants go on a family visit during the interview process.
- 2 days of new staff training
  - o Includes video of services, assessment, procedures, funding,
- First 2-3 weeks are scheduled by the program coordinator so the new hire can see various services and have various experiences based on the checklist.
- Everyone new employee gets a mentor for 3 years. Coordinator meets with mentors.
  - Checklist what a new provider should experience and learn.
- Program Coordinator has one on one meetings with each employee
  - o Check in with employee
  - Ask what support they need to be successful
- New staff monthly meetings
  - Agenda to address needs, presentations by other providers, the topic is shared with all employees, and they are welcome to attend too.
- The program has created videos of high-quality service for employees to watch and learn from.
- Staff Meeting ideas watch child developmental videos with discussion questions

Questions/Comments:

- Appreciation of high-quality training for providers
- The time spent on the process and procedures including the information that you need to share, then it saves work and supports staff.
- They have very low turnover.

• Building on knowledge slowly has been very effective.
